CHADRON, NEBRASKA July 8th, 2025 DAWES COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS

The Public convened meeting of the Dawes County Commissioners in regular session commenced at the hour of 9:05 AM, on the 8th day of July, 2025 pursuant to public notice as required by law. The meeting was called to order by Chairman Vic Rivera. Board Members present were Walter Juhlin and Jake Stewart. Also present was Adam Edmund, Deputy County Attorney; Lindy Coleman, Assessor; Sam Wellnitz, Treasurer; Wade Yada, Highway Superintendent; Tom Menke, Chadron City Manager, Deann Koerber, and Casey Keim. Per LB 898, Commissioner Rivera announced the location of the Open Meetings Act located on the door by the United States Flag. Copies of the Act are available upon request. Commissioner Stewart, seconded by Juhlin, moved to approve the agenda. Roll call vote, Ayes: Juhlin, Stewart and Rivera. Nays: None. Motion carried.

Minutes of the June 24th, 2025 Commissioner Meeting were reviewed with the amendment of the grant award of \$750 for the promotion of the 4th of July weekend needing to be amended from the awardee of City of Crawford to the Crawford Area Chamber of Commerce. Commissioner Stewart motioned, seconded by Juhlin, moved to approve the amendment. Roll call vote, Ayes: Stewart, Rivera and Juhlin. Nays: None. Motion carried. Commissioner Stewart motioned, seconded by Juhlin, moved to approve the minutes from June 24th, 2025. Roll call vote, Ayes: Stewart, Rivera and Juhlin. Nays: None. Motion carried

Monthly fee/mileage reports of the various departments were approved by general consent of the Board. Claims were reviewed. Commissioner Stewart motioned, seconded by Juhlin, moved to approve all claims as submitted. Roll call vote, Ayes: Rivera, Juhlin and Stewart. Nays: None. Motion carried.

Correspondence acknowledged by the Board was a letter received from Micaela Wuehler from Lincoln County informing the Board the of changes to the Nebraska Broadband Deployment Program. Commissioner Stewart informed the board he has already written one letter in support of funding for the high-speed grant. Commissioner Stewart plans on drafting an additional letter for the board to show their support for the Nebraska Broadband Deployment Program.

Chairman Rivera opened the meeting for public comment at 9:15am. No public comments were made.

At 9:15 AM, Wade Yada, Highway Superintendent, met with the Board for road updates. In district one, the crew is hauling gravel to Stockade Rd. They are also working on a culvert replacement on Trinkle Rd. They plan on hauling gravel for McHenry Rd. In district two, the crew is hauling gravel for Table Rd. In district three, the crew is hauling gravel for North Whitney Lake Rd. They are planning on hauling to Lemmon Rd. once that is completed. In additional department updates, there have not been any applications for the part time truck driver position yet. The crusher crew is operational after repairs to the rock crusher. The scraper is being put back together this week and is expected to be finished by the end of the week.

At 9:30 AM, Discussion ensued regarding APHIS cooperative agreement. There are concerns over the split of time in the proposed contract. Currently, there is proposed \$10,000.00 for aerial expense. The board would like a clarification as to how many hours of flight this would provide and a clarification if APHIS has access to a plane. Commissioner Juhlin posed the question if one agent can realistically cover four counties and what that coverage would actually look like for Dawes County residents. Commissioner Stewart stated we would need more coverage and clarify stated in the proposed contract. Deputy County Attorney, Adam

Edmund, brought up the possibility of subcontracting to manage predator categories separately. He also informed that Sioux County has not made a decision in regard to the cooperative agreement yet. Commissioner Juhlin said he had also been in contact with Shawn Patras about predator control options and they spoke about the possibility of a coyote bounty to help control the coyote population. They would still need to figure out how to setup a level of management to control that program if the county wished to pursue that as an option. Commissioner Juhlin posed the question if we could fund subcontracts for pest birds and prairie dogs in addition to the proposed APHIS contract. Deputy County Attorney, Adam Edmund, stated if we commit to the proposed APHIS contract there would likely not be any funding available for alternative avenues of control. Adam Edmund did bring up the option of reducing the proposed contract to create funding for subcontracts for additional predator control measures. The Board stated they would like to have a representative from APHIS come back in and further clarify the proposed contract at the next meeting if possible.

At 9:40 AM, Commissioner Stewart discussed a transition for Deb Lesmeister from the Predator Control Secretary to the vacant Safety Committee Secretary due to the elimination of the Predator Control department. Commissioner Stewart motioned, seconded by Juhlin, moved to approve the appointment to the Safety Committee Secretary position. Roll call vote, Ayes: Rivera, Juhlin and Stewart. Nays: None. Motion carried.

At 9:42 AM, Deann Koerber and Casey Keim brought forth the final draft of the personnel policy manual to be signed by the Board. Commissioner Stewart motioned, seconded by Juhlin, moved to approve the final draft of the personnel policy manual. Roll call vote, Ayes: Rivera, Juhlin and Stewart. Nays: None. Motion carried.

At 9:43 AM, An application for use of the courthouse grounds was presented to the board by Fur Trade Days, Inc. for use for the vendor market, expositions, food trucks, and live music. Commissioner Stewart motioned, seconded by Juhlin, moved to approve courthouse grounds application. Roll call vote, Ayes: Rivera, Juhlin and Stewart. Nays: None. Motion carried.

At 9:44 AM, Adam Edmund addressed the lodging tax letter which was issued from his office on July 7th, 2025. He stated a copy of the regulations were sent out with the letter to businesses. Tom Menke, Chadron City Manager asked how often the businesses will need to report on the lodging tax. Adam stated the reporting will need to be quarterly and businesses will be responsible for filing the correct paperwork. He stated these letters were sent out from a list provided to his office from tourism director Kerri Rempp.

At 9:45 AM, the Board was presented with a grant request for The Slim Days Foundation. The grant request was submitted for \$2125.00. Dawes County Tourism Board recommended a grant in the amount of \$900.00 for The Slim Days Foundation. Commissioner Stewart motioned, seconded by Juhlin, moved to approve the \$900.00 grant for The Slim Days Foundation. Roll call vote, Ayes: Rivera, Juhlin and Stewart. Nays: None. Motion carried.

At 9:47 AM, the Board was presented with a surplus request from Treasurer Sam Wellnitz for 1 Steelcase 6-drawer cabinet and 3 6-drawer Anderson-Hockey file cabinets. Commissioner Stewart recommended opening up bidding for the surplus items for a period of two weeks to be opened on the July 22nd, 2025 meeting. Commissioner Stewart motioned, seconded by Juhlin, moved to approve surplus. Roll call vote, Ayes: Rivera, Juhlin and Stewart. Nays: None. Motion carried.

At 9:50 AM, Assessor Lindy Coleman, discussed designating MIPS as the printer for the LB 644 Postcards. MIPS can pull the information directly from our system for the cards. The Board agrees with the Assessor's recommendation.

At 9:55 AM, Brad Johnson, the planning engineer for Northwest Rural Public Power District presented a petition for road crossing to trench across Table Rd. The project is to replace underground cable which was installed in 1978. The trenching request would close the project site on Table Rd just west of the Hereford Rd intersection for approximately 1 hour depending on the fiber location and would be trenched at a depth determined by Dawes County Superintendent Wade Yada. Commissioner Stewart motioned, seconded by Juhlin, moved to approve the petition of road crossing for NWRPPD. Roll call vote, Ayes: Rivera, Juhlin and Stewart. Nays: None. Motion carried.

At 10:00 AM, Adam Edmund provided the update on the Crawford Law Enforcement agreement that we are waiting on budget numbers before we proceed.

There being no further business before the Board the meeting was adjourned at 10:02 AM. The next meeting of the Dawes County Commissioners will be held on July 22, 2025 beginning at 9:00 AM. The meeting will be held in the Dawes County Commissioner Room. The agenda will close at noon on July 17, 2025. All Resolutions adopted by the Dawes County Board of Commissioners are available for public inspection during normal business hours of the County Clerk's Office.
